The Magic Kingdom is the most visited theme park in the world, so it is incredibly important to choose the right time to visit. Choose well and you'll breeze through the park, but pick bad and you can find yourself queuing for hours to climb one of the Space Mountain rocket ships. Overall, the best time to visit the Magic Kingdom is the off-peak months of September and January, when crowds and spending are at their lowest. However, by visiting during the off-peak season, you can also skip special events that take place during the more popular months, so decide what is most important to you before choosing the time. The Magic Kingdom is divided into parts, with Cinderella's castle in the heart. Six Lands Frontierland, Fantasyland, Adventureland, Main Street USA, Liberty Square, and Tomorrowland. The areas are highly themed and include different smells, sounds, food and foliage in each section. Your tastes, as well as the age of your children, will dictate where you spend the most time. Toddlers can't get enough of Fantasyland, where their favorite movie stars will come to life through the travel area, and in-person meet and greet, while older kids and teens are more likely to prefer Frontierland, where very popular rides like Splash Mountain and The Haunted Mansion reside. Disney has introduced a controversial spike in ticket prices for Magic Kingdom 2016. Each day of the year is classified as cost, regular, or peak day, and follows a price structure that has been in place for rooms in place for years. However, since prices are calculated on a daily basis, you may find that attending on Easter Sunday is more expensive than going on weekends during the summer, depending on past attendance records. Disney is transparent with this pricing structure and publishes the calendar in detail what days fall into each category. Florida is known for hot temperatures, high humidity and plenty of sunshine all year round. Temperatures are at their harshest in July and August and regularly climb into the upper 90s. From October to May, the weather in Florida is more moderate during the day, but can be cold at night and early in the morning. The hurricane season lasts from June to October, although the probability of a hurricane hitting Florida during your stay is low. The months of June, July and August are no doubt filled with guests, but you may be surprised to learn that the Christmas season can be even more crowded, depending on the day. If you have no choice, you should avoid visiting on these dates: New Year (January 1st)Martin Luther King Jr. (third Monday in January) Presidents Day (third Monday in February)Valentine's Day (February 14) Easter Sunday (March to April) Independence Day (July 4) Thanksgiving (third Thursday in November) (December 24) December) In terms of low crowds, mild weather, and the best prices, September and January are the best times to visit. February, May and early November are also great choices, although you can expect a few more crowds and slightly higher prices. If you should visit during the summer, avoid weekends (including Fridays) as they are no doubt busy days. Whether you are an early bird, your best course of action is to go to the Magic Kingdom any day, at least 15 minutes before the opening. If you rely on Disney's transportation system, allow at least 30 minutes of travel time to arrive at the entrance to the park. Coming early will allow you to be one of the first guests to enter the park, and head quickly to your favorite attractions that will be packed later in the day. If you decide to stay at a property at a Disney resort (such as Grand Floridian, Pop Century, or Port Orleans), you have some additional advantages when visiting Magic Kingdom. When checking in, pay attention to the daily parking schedule you receive as part of the check-in package. This schedule will list an additional magic watch available only to guests of the resort during your visit. Extra magic hours is the best time to visit. They are designed to allow resort guests an extra hour, either before the park opens or after it is closed, to ride popular attractions like This Little World, Big Thunder Mountain Railroad, and Space Mountain with minimal waiting time. If you're behind its location, or even at Disney's nice neighbor hotel that sits on the edge of a Disney property, you won't unfortunately be able to take advantage of the extra magic clock. Your best choice to visit the Magic Kingdom will be in the middle of the week either on Tuesday or Wednesday. Thursday is usually a little more crowded, but a far cry from the weekend crowd. If you can't bear the thought of waking up that early, you can go the night owl route instead and arrive at the park in the early evening. You have to make a lunch reservation for 4 or 5pm and then hit the rides when you're done (if you can stomach it). Starting around 6 p.m., park crowds begin thinning as guests make their way to dinner, so you can take advantage of this time gap. Spring can be a good time to visit the Magic Kingdom as the weather is usually quite pleasant, but beware of crowds-predictable, Magic Kingdom is an extremely popular spring break destination and it shows. May, before Memorial Day weekend, can be the perfect time to visit if you want to avoid the crowds. Summer is the peak season in the park, and the weather may be less than perfect. Temperatures are often hot, and Florida's humidity is at its extreme. If you are due to visit during the summer, visit at the end of August; He it would be hot, but the crowds began to freeze as more children returned to school. Typically, September and the beginning of autumn are the big month of Disney World's visit. The kids are back at school, so the crowds are dwindling. The fall (until November 30) is a hurricane hurricane in Florida, but the likelihood of that affecting your trip is unlikely. A late fall trip, between Thanksgiving and Christmas, can be perfect if you want great weather and minimal crowds. I'm sure author Katherine Newman wasn't expecting or intending for her book focused on teaching children basic life skills to be released during a pandemic, but here we are. And with our kids home for the summer, and many more months of varying degrees of isolation ahead of us, it seems like the perfect time for them to learn how to chop onions, address an envelope or sew on a button. When I first started reading through How to Be Human, I intended only to mine it for useful ideas to share with you all. But to that when I got through the first section called Other Creatures: How to Care for People, Pets and and I've been suffocating. All this is read as gentle advice from a trusted mentor. She writes this in an introduction that speaks directly to the children: Look, we realize that maybe you don't pick this book all on your own. Maybe your adults even passive-aggressively gave it to you for your birthday along with a pair of rubber gloves and a piston. (Welcome!) But it doesn't matter because we are convinced that many of the tasks that we tend to think of as things can be really helpful, especially if you have a chance to step toward them with confidence rather than being supported in them, that bulldozer nagging otherwise known as your mom or dad. There's a joke in my family about a time when I'm all 19 or 20 years old and living in... Morenewman's writing is clear and straightforward, even funny from time to time, and never feels condescending or judgmental towards children. Each section is 2-4 pages long and written in a quasi-graphic novel style with adorable illustrations (Debbie Fong), so it's easy to digest. It covers a variety of topics broken down into seven chapters: Other creatures: How to care for people, pets and plants in your lifeUsing it right: How to be kind and get your item AcrossDirty Things: How to Clean and Take Care of Your Home Cooking: How to Make Food and Find Your Way Around The KitchenSwe Wear it?: How to Clean and Care for Your Clothes: How to Get, Give , and spend MoneyUseful Skills: How to make basic important thingsImage: Katherine NewmanWhat really amazes me about this book is that it would be perfect for children who do not have strong role models in their lives and can feel uncomfortable asking a friend or teacher how to do simple, everyday things like wrap a gift or scramble an egg, not to mention something more complicated how to learn how to save money. The book format makes it easy to skim, allowing children to quickly find the themes that most resonate with them. As Newman also writes: The truth is that he feels good doing meaningful things and he feels good to be appreciated, and these skills pretty much guarantee a combination of these two good feelings: Meet the smartest parents on Earth!
